Installing rooftop solar

Mosman Public School installed a 50kW solar system in April 2020. This generates approximately 73,000kWh of energy, which is equivalent to the power it would take to run 311 computers or 11 homes for a year.

Rooftop solar provides an estimated energy saving of 23%, reducing the school power bill by approx \$8,500 each year.

The school paid for the installation by hosting a fundraising screening of the film 2040 at the local cinema followed by a Q&A session with filmmaker Damon Gameau. Mosman Public School families and friends were joined by the State and Federal MPs and the Mosman Mayor, for the film.
